


Turnitin Assignment For Students

How to Access and Upload Turnitin Assignments:


Navigate to the course which your instructor has made the assignment.



Click on the **Assignment Name** at the top of your assignment dashboard to reveal more information about the assignment. This area displays the assignment information.



If a rubric or grading form has been uploaded by your instructor, it will appear linked under the GradeMark rubric area

1. From the Turnitin Assignment dashboard, select **Upload Submission** to make a submission to the assignment.



2. Select the upload method from the tabs at the top of the Submit File.
 - **Upload Submission** - Allows you to upload an allowed file type (pdf, doc, docx, pps) directly to Turnitin.
Select the Browse button, or drag your file directly onto the modal.
 - **Text Input** - Allows you to submit just the text of your assignment directly to Turnitin.
Select the Text Input tab.
Enter or paste your **submission title** into the Submission Title field.
Enter or paste your **submission text** into the Submission Text field.
 - **Cloud Submission** - Allows you to submit from a cloud drive.
Select the Cloud Submission tab and choose a submission option from the dropdown list.
Select your file within the cloud drive.


3. Select **Upload and Review** to proceed to the review stage.
4. **Submit to Turnitin.**



How to Access the Similarity Report:

The Similarity Report can be accessed from the **Assignment Inbox**. *If your Instructor allows it*

- Select the desired assignment in order to access the **Assignment Inbox**.
- Select the **Paper Title** or **Similarity score** from the % column.



How to View Similarity Matches:

Feedback Studio allows students to access the similarity report, spelling and grammar suggestions, as well as instructor comments and grades.

Main Components:

1. **Tab :**
 - **Name:** Student name and file name.
 - **Viewing your grades:** Overall grade is shown and you can also see the maximum marks available for this assignment.
2. **Body:** The matches are numbered and color-coded to make it easier for you to understand.
3. **Page navigation:** Used to change pages quickly. Click to expand a thumbnail gallery of each page.
4. **Active layers:** Used to toggle on/off the different viewing layers of the Feedback Studio.

5. **Instructor feedback layer:** This panel shows the instructor's feedback, there are two types of Instructor feedback:



Summary comments: A summary comment is an overall comment given by your instructor regarding your whole paper.

Bubble comments: A bubble comment may be highlighted and linked to a specific piece of text

Rubric: If your instructor has used a rubric or grading form to grade your paper, you can view the criteria and scale that they have used to grade.

- To access the rubric for your assignment, click the speech bubble icon from the product toolbar.
- Select the **View Rubric** button from the Instructor Feedback side panel to open the scorecard.

6. **Similarity Layer:** In this panel there are options to view items from the Turnitin Similarity report. The similarity report allows instructors to easily find matches or similar text within submitted work.



Match Percentage: The Similarity panel displays the percentage of the submission which matches sources in the Turnitin database.



All Sources: In the All Sources side panel, all of the sources that have been found are displayed and sorted by the highest percentage matched. Clicking on any source will display a short section of text from that source, highlighting which words match the submissions.



Filter: This icon will enable a filter to exclude certain items such as, quotes and bibliographies from the overall percentage.

7. **Downloading the Similarity Report:** Similarity Reports can be downloaded in PDF format for ease of viewing.



Download: Select **Current View** to start the download of your Similarity Report.



Submission information: Include some extra information about the paper, such as the submission date, submission ID, and word count

8. **Text-only report:** Turnitin Feedback Studio will remain open in your previous window. You can also click on the blue Document Viewer link at the top to load it again.
