
How to Create a Blog Entry:

1. On the Blogs listing page, select a **Blog title**.
2. On the Blogs topic page, select **Create Blog Entry**.
3. Type a title and entry.
4. If enabled and appropriate, select the check box for Post Entry as Anonymous.
5. Select **Browse My Computer** to Upload a file from your computer. You can also attach a file from the repository; Course Files or the Content Collection.
6. Select Post Entry to **Submit** the blog entry or select **Save Entry as Draft** to add the entry later.

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Blog Topic Page

The blog topic page is divided into two main sections: the content frame and the sidebar.

1. **Create Blog Entry:** You can create as many blog entries as you want.
2. **Blog Instructions:** Expand the section to review the blog instructions.
3. **View Drafts:** Access entries saved as drafts.
4. **Blog Entry:** Your blog entries appear in the content frame.
5. **Comment:** Select to add your thoughts.
6. **Blog Details:** In the sidebar, Expand the section to view the blog information, including comments if any were made.
7. **Expand the Section:** View a list of who else has made blog entries. Select a name to view the entries.
8. **Grade:** This section appears if your instructor enabled grading for the blog. You can see if your blog entries have been graded.

9. **Index:** View the titles of your selected entries for either the week or the month, based on the settings your instructor makes during blog creation. The most recent entry title appears first.
