How to Create a Blog Entry:

- 1. On the Blogs listing page, select a **Blog title**.
- 2. On the Blogs topic page, select Create Blog Entry.
- 3. Type a title and entry.
- 4. If enabled and appropriate, select the check box for Post Entry as Anonymous.
- 5. Select **Browse My Computer** to Upload a file from your computer. You can also attach a file from the repository; Course Files or the Content Collection.
- 6. Select Post Entry to **Submit** the blog entry or select **Save Entry as Draft** to add the entry later.

1. Create Blog Entry: You can create as many blog entries as you want.

- 2. Blog Instructions: Expand the section to review the blog instructions.
- 3. View Drafts: Access entries saved as drafts.
- 4. Blog Entry: Your blog entries appear in the content frame.
- 5. Comment: Select to add your thoughts.
- 6. **Blog Details:** In the sidebar, Expand the section to view the blog information, including comments if any were made.
- 7. Expand the Section: View a list of who else has made blog entries. Select a name to view the entries.
- 8. **Grade:** This section appears if your instructor enabled grading for the blog. You can see if your blog entries have been graded.
